



USJA Police Activities League (PAL) Clubs

A Police Activities League, or PAL, is a program offered by many police, sheriff, and correctional agencies. It is specifically aligned with a recognized law enforcement agency. In most cases, members of the law enforcement agency help mentor and coach youth within their immediate community. The goal is for the law enforcement agency to reach out to young people who may be geographically and/or economically at-risk.

The focus of a PAL often centers around sports activities (judo, soccer, baseball, etc.), but also includes educational and leadership programs. In most cases, PAL programs are supported by the sponsoring law enforcement agency with funding or materials. PAL organizations will also seek funds, equipment, and volunteers from members of its community - often as a nonprofit organization.
